I hope you had a very nice Easter. I thought I did, for a few hours. I was thankful for a fruitful Lenten season culminating in two fairly well attended Easter services. I went around all day Sunday and most of Monday thinking I had done a good job in my Easter sermons. I thought I was bold, but not arrogant, smooth but not contrived. I was confident in what I was teaching, had a good mastery of the story of Peter's fall from grace and eventual restoration as presented in detail in St. John's gospel.

The only thing that worried me was whether my congregation could appreciate such fine preaching. I noticed several people in the early service with a sort of neither-here-nor-there look on their faces. I figured it was just that they weren't quite awake yet. Then in the late service I noticed more of those looks, and some others I couldn't interpret. But the Force was strong with me-I was patient and loving toward these people. Even if they couldn't fully appreciate what I was giving them, they were growing and would eventually be able. I congratulated myself on being a really good pastor, and not nearly as ugly as I could be at this age.

Then late Monday afternoon I had a chance to view the video recording of the late service and watched in disbelief as I repeatedly referred to the scripture reading from Mark 16 as coming from St. John's gospel. And I did it in both services. (Don't bother looking for my humiliation in the online video-I've drastically edited it. It's choppy, but the basic message of our Lord's grace toward Peter, and us, comes through.)

My hope is that my error was not so obtrusive as to keep God's message from coming through for our members and friends who were in the services. That message in the resurrection of Jesus is that God seeks us when we fall, just as he sought Peter; that he will never leave or forsake us; that there is no darkness that can overcome his life and light.

And please stop sending get well wishes. I'm okay.
